What is an Educational Psychologist (EP)?

An EP is someone who is trained to work with children, parents, carers, teachers and other adults. Your parents or carers will know that the EP is coming to see you.

We can help with making things better in school.

- Learning and concentrating
- Friendship and feelings
- Speaking and listening
- Feeling included in school
- Anything you are worried about





What might we do?

- Visit you in school, or at home
- Ask you questions about things you do, what you like, what you find hard and how you feel about school
- Ask you to draw, do puzzles, read, write or do number work
- Talk with people who know you well
- Look at some of your work

What will happen after our visit?

- There may be a meeting with your teachers and parents or carers to talk about how to help you
- We might write to you or your teachers and parents or carers to let you know what we think
- We may come and see you again
